Houston PetSet Friends,

On behalf of the entire Houston PetSet team, we extend our deepest gratitude to each and every one of you for your invaluable support. Your contributions, whether through donations, sponsorships, volunteering, or advocacy, are the driving force behind our mission.

In 2024, your support allowed us to make great strides in our mission by supporting homeless animals, pets with medical emergencies, and our partner animal welfare rescue organizations.

Highlights include:

- Hosted State of the Animal Welfare with local officials. Houston Mayor John Whitmire introduced his Animal Welfare Initiative to combine resources and overall serve more animals in the community.
- Transported more than 1,500 dogs, cats, puppies, and kittens to Minnesota for better chance at adoption, which opened up space at local shelters to serve more animals.
- Performed over 4,100 low cost/free spay & neuters.
- Sponsored more than 3,200 spay & neuter surgeries through clinics.
- Provided vaccine & microchips to more than 6,800 pets.
- Helped pet owners with emergency care by granting over \$325,000 in medical services.
- Jumped into action when Hurricane Beryl impacted Houston, by providing 12,000 ponds of much needed food and supplies to pet owners and shelters in need.
- Raised more than \$1 million #ForTheAnimals at The Fierce & Fabulous Soirée.
- Awarded more than \$400,000 to 92 deserving animal rescues.
- Provided over 300 dog houses, crates, and straw for outside pets during our extreme cold weather.

While we celebrate our accomplishments, we remain focused on our six areas of impact including Rescue, Adopt & Transport, Spay & Neuter, Community Service & Education, Cruelty Prevention, Research, and Advocacy. We look forward to all the lives we will change in 2025, and we are honored to do so with your continued support. #ForTheAnimals in 2025.

To provide resources to build the capacity of other animal welfare organizations, and to improve the public perception and treatment of companion animals.

We achieve our objectives through a strategic plan that focuses on the following six impact areas:

- Spay & Neuter
 - Provide free and/or low-cost spay/neuter surgeries to communities that need it most
- Community Service & Education
 - Implement and support programs to help the public provide proper care to their pets, and support pet owners with emergency funds
- Advocacy
 - Increase engagement to influence public policy and affect legislation at local and state levels
- Rescue, Adopt & Transport
 - Increase capacity amongst rescue, foster, adoption organizations through funding and transport opportunities
- Cruelty Prevention
 - Decrease animal cruelty, and fund and train the agencies that protect animals from abuse
- Research
 - Build and leverage our collection of qualitative and quantitative data to inform lasting solutions

GRANTS

Houston PetSet's Annual Grant program continued to see incredible growth in 2024. Records were broken yet again, with more than \$400,000 being distributed amongst 92 deserving animal welfare nonprofits.

SPAY & NEUTER

Provide free or low-cost spay/neuter options to communities that need it most.



The Houston PetSet Mobile Spay/Neuter Unit team sterilized, vaccinated, and microchipped more than 4,100 owned pets in 2024.

In addition to these surgeries subsidized by the City of Houston, we were able to sponsor more than 3,200 cats and dogs at our partner clinics and through mass-spay/neuter events. These additional numbers would not be possible without the support of individual donors and foundations.

RESCUE, ADOPT & TRANSPORT

Increase capacity amongst rescue, foster, adoption organizations through funding, adoption, and transport opportunities.



In 2024, Houston PetSet was able to transport more than 1,500 puppies, kittens, cats, and dogs to adoption centers in Minnesota. Thanks to the Wolly Kitten Club, Angel of Hope, The Babinski Foundation, and the Animal Humane Society for your partnership in animal welfare. These homeless animals were given a better chance at adoption while at the same time alleviating the pressure of overcrowding in the Houston shelters and rescues.

COMMUNITY SERVICE & EDUCATION

Implement and support programs to help the public provide proper care to their pets.



In 2024, Houston PetSet broke records by providing free microchips and vaccines to more than 6,800 pets. These events were also an opportunity to offer free or low-cost spay/neuter services and free food to participating families.

We also provided more than \$325,000 in emergency funds to pet owners in need of assistance with medical bills and supplies so they could keep their beloved pets.

In July, Hurricane Beryl impacted the Houston and surrounding areas, which left animal shelters, rescues, and pet owners in desperate need of food and essential supplies. Houston PetSet and The Babinski Foundation jumped into action by providing 12,000 pounds of food and supplies, plus transporting more than 50 dogs and puppies. In December, Houston experienced several winter storms that brought frigid cold temperatures to our area. We provided more than 300 dog houses, crates, and straw to protect animals during these extreme conditions.

CRUELTY PREVENTION

Decrease animal cruelty, and fund and train the agencies that protect animals from abuse.



The connection between domestic violence and animal cruelty is often overlooked, highlighting a new initiative aimed at helping both human and animal survivors. Houston PetSet, Crime Stoppers of Houston, and the Houston Area Women's Center (HAWC) worked together to raise awareness about animal cruelty and its link to domestic violence. The goal is to address the needs of both human and animal victims of domestic violence.

RESEARCH

Build and leverage our collection of qualitative and quantitative data to inform lasting solutions.



As part of our yearly granting cycle, Houston PetSet collects information on the number of people and animals helped annually by our grant applicants. These hard-working groups together served nearly 602,500 people and assisted more than 157,500 animals.

ADVOCACY

Increase engagement to influence public policy and affect legislation at local and state levels.

This includes doing away with duplication of services between Houston and Harris County and finding a way to combine resources to serve animals and the community better.




Hundreds of Rescue Partners!

FINANCE

In 2024, 74 cents of every dollar donated to Houston PetSet was spent on critical programming for the animals, including spay and neuter, transport, and emergency grants.

Houston PetSet remained true to our mission in 2024 by targeting direct-service programs and funding animal welfare organizations in the Greater Houston area. Contributions supported established programs including spay/neuter, transport, emergency cases, and free vaccine and microchip clinics. We also granted more than \$400,000 to our rescue and service partners at the end of the year.

We raised money for critical programs and spent it wisely. We will continue to utilize our resources strategically and carefully to ensure donations are used for the most significant impact.
